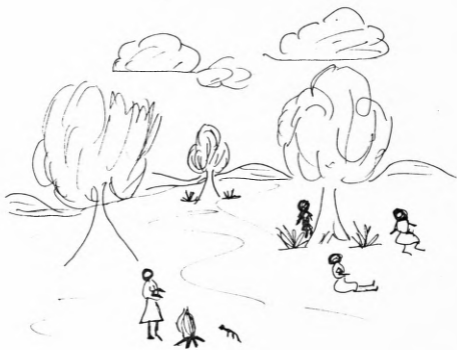

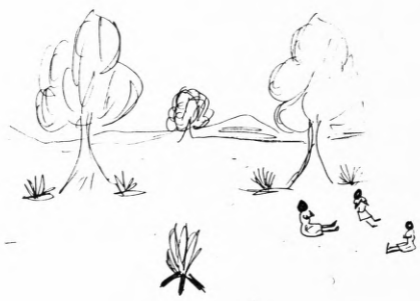

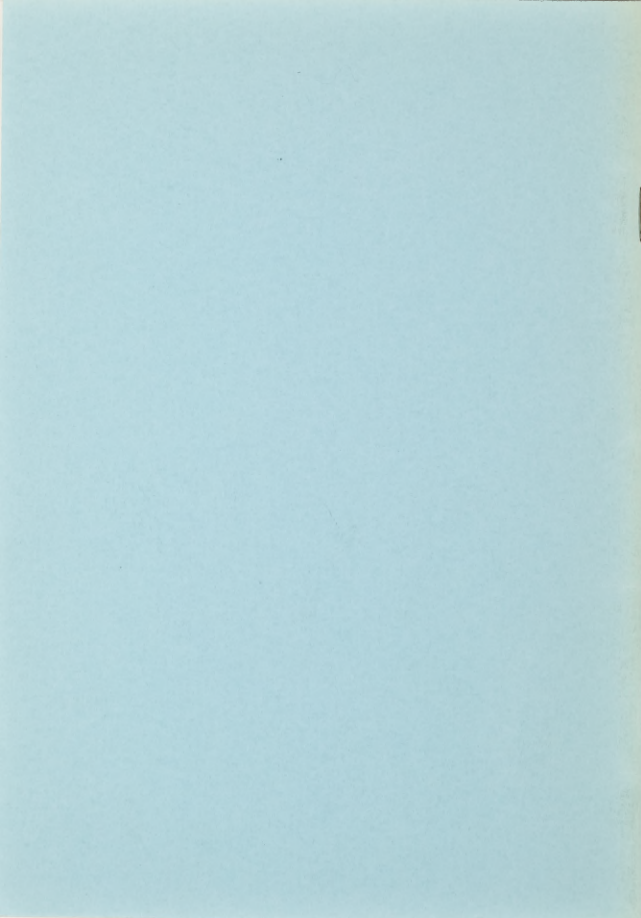
# Hunting for Goanna
