- LB10. *Unique item* TURNER, Henry Gyles and SUTHERLAND: The Development of Australian Literature. London, Longmans Green, 1898. Cr.8vo, pp.343. Ills. and ports. Original green paper covers with bookplate of the litterateur and critic, Bertram Stevens inside front cover. Interleaved copy with holograph notes by Stevens plus holograph index of authors. The whole bound in heavy navy blue cloth boards for Colin Roderick by Hastings, Townsville, 1970. Unique copy, really classifies as MS. because of Stevens's writings in it. Suggest index in MSS and treat as unique
- LB11. Henry Lawson Collection: Index Cards.
A series of working index cards useful for students working on research projects in the Colin Roderick Collection. The cards sometimes carry more information than appears in the Consignment lists.
Note: that some cards in series 1 bear information related to titles that were to have cards in the other series had no cards been available for use at the time, so that the backs of cards used for earlier research that had issued in publication had to be re-used. There are few of these and they are easily discernible. The series runs:
1. Index of individual prose titles, with essential information on publication.
Note that all such information concerning the verse appears at the end of each poem in Colin Roderick's Memorial Edition, Collected Verse, 3 vols, 1967-9. (Angus & Robertson, Sydney) of which a set is included in the collection.
Note also that publishing history appears for most of the prose in Henry Lawson The Master Story Teller: Commentary on His Prose Works, Sydney, 1985 (295 cards)
 2. Index of bound volume of correspondence (9 cards); prose MSS. (19); verse MSS. (11); early printings (4); criticism (3) (46)
 3. Index of Lawson's contemporary publications (38 cards)
 4. Index of publications, mostly contemporary, containing compositions by or about Lawson of both critical and biographical interest (28 cards)
 5. Index of complete posthumous editions of Lawson prose and verse (16 cards)
 6. Selections for Lawson's works published posthumously as monographs, first editions mainly (25 cards)
 7. Index of bibliographical monographs (2 cards)
(Note: Bibliography of Lawson's Prose writings to follow in Consignment 7 II) (400+ cards)
- LB12. Another collection of 30 photographs of places associated with Henry Lawson.
1. Inscription by Dame Mary Gilmore on back of drawing of Lawson by George Lambert with 6 x 8's sitting on the bed, Sydney Hospital 1902 (not 1912 as written at left foot). The man on the bed is Henry Cargill, but his pseudonym was "The Dipsomaniac".
 2. The Eurunderee Public School, 1914. Believed to have been built by Lawson's father, Niels, with Henry assisting as an adolescent.
