Despite high levels of support for law reform recorded amongst the Australian public and a reasonable section of the medical profession, since the overturning of the Northern Territory Rights of the Terminally Ill Act in 1997, voluntary euthanasia has remained illegal in Australia. Nevertheless, there has been significant activity on the issue, with bills seeking to reform the law on the practice introduced in all of the Australian state parliaments except Queensland. This paper examines the present legislative attempts to legalise voluntary euthanasia in two Australian state parliaments: South Australia and Tasmania
